## Spotlight on Light Painting 闪光灯下新艺术:光影涂鸭

<u>Acrylic</u>, oil and water-based paints, **canvas**, <u>celluloid</u> film – all are well-known **mediums** for painting and **photography**. But what happens when these two means of artistic **expression** are **brought together**, and paint is replaced with light? You get <u>light painting</u>, of course.

Light painting involves taking pictures in a dark room, or some other dark location, and moving either a light source or the camera itself to produce lines of light on the finished photograph. These lines of lights **resemble** some sort of image or design. The first person to use this technique was <u>Man Ray</u>, who in 1935, published **a series of** photographs called "Space Writing," But this was not known until 74 years later, when photographer Ellen Carey discovered that Ray had actually signed his name on the pictures with a **penlight**.

光影涂鸦包含了在暗室或其它昏暗的地点里拍照,以移动光源或照相机,使完成的照片里产生光的线条。这些光的线条像是某种图案或设计。第一位运用此技术的人是曼. 雷,他于 1935 年发表了一系列名为《Space Writing》的摄影作品。但他的光影涂鸦却直到 74 年后,在摄影师艾伦. 凯莉发现雷的确用小手电筒在他自己的照片上签名时才为人所知。

Several famous artists have **dabbled in** light painting over the years, perhaps none more **highly-regarded** than <u>Pablo Picasso</u>. One day in 1949, he was visited by <u>Gjon Mili</u>, a **pioneer** in the world of light painting. Mili showed Picasso his pictures of ice skaters with lights **attached to** their skates. This inspired Picasso to pick up a **flashlight** and draw light images in the air, and led to a series of pictures known as Picasso's light drawings. If you'd like to **give** light painting **a try** as well, you don't need much – just a camera, a **tripod**, a flashlight, and a dark room, and you're good to go!

多年来,已有一些知名的艺术家涉足光影涂鸦,其中最受好评的或许就是巴勃罗.毕加索了。在 1949 年的某天.格杨.米利去拜访毕加索;米利是光影涂鸦界的先驱,他让毕加索看他拍的溜冰者照片, 他们的冰鞋上装上灯。毕加索受到这些照片的启发,拿起手电筒在空中画了些光影,创造出一系列的 毕加索光影涂鸦作品。如果你也想试试光影涂鸦,你不需要有很多东西——只要一台相机、一个三脚 架、一支手电筒及一间暗房,你就准备好了,可以拍啰!
